Grace Street opened August 1, 2023 as the Mid-shore's sole recovery community organization (RCO). An RCO is an independent, peer-led, non-profit that focuses on recovery from substance use disorders. RCOs respect all pathways and does not exclude anyone.

Grace Street provides non-clinical, community-centered supports, including peer support; harm reduction resources; street outreach; workforce training and development; life skills development; youth programming; overdose prevention activities and resources; and support groups.

Grace Street serves people in Easton and Talbot County, and in neighboring counties across the Mid-Shore. Referrals are not necessary and supports are free.

Talbot Safe Station

Safe stations offer a no-barrier, ease-of-access safe place for people to get help for addiction.

As Talbot County's Safe Station, a Grace Street peer is available 24 hours each day to connect people with treatment or other resources.

Grace Street also provides transportation to treatment.

Peers are people with lived experience; peer support is an evidence-based practice that has become an increasingly integral part of addiction recovery.

Peer Support

Grace Street peers have received formal training and provide 24-hour recovery support, including recovery plans, recovery groups, skill development, goal setting, transportation, and access to resources.

Harm Reduction

Grace Street is an authorized Overdose Response Program, providing overdose education and dispensing Naloxone and other harm reduction supplies, including drug test strips.

Grace Street operates the region's first harm reduction vending machine, which includes Naloxone, Fentanyl, Xylazine and Medetomidine test strips.

We also have harm reduction distribution boxes ('Barneys') at locations across the Mid-Shore for 24hour, no-barrier access. Visit our website for locations.

Recovery Community Org.

The core principles of an RCO are: **Recovery Vision:** RCOs focus on enhancing supports and services available to people seeking and sustaining recovery. This includes embracing all pathways, meeting people where they are – not where we think they should be. RCOs also work to influence public and private policies including access to effective treatment.

Authentic Voice: RCOs share an authentic voice, which means the interests of the community are represented by organizations that draw leadership from members of the recovery community. "Nothing about us, without us."

Accountable to the Recovery Community: RCOs are accountable to the recovery community and are not influenced by clinical or legal entities.
